# COVID-19 UPDATE

As parents/carers may be aware, a number of local schools have been closed for cleaning and contact tracing in recent weeks due to either suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-19 in students or school community members. We understand this raises questions for some families where HVS students have siblings that attend other school settings. Our understanding is that unless siblings or their family have been notified by DHHS as a close contact and directed to self-isolate or self-quarantine then they are able to attend school. Parents may choose to be cautious in this situation and keep them home.

If parents are unsure what they should do they can contact the school (teacher or principal class) for advice. Again we would remind families that if your child has even the mildest symptoms please keep them home and we encourage you to have them tested. Our first priority as a school will continue to be the health and safety or our students, staff and community.

Today it was announced by the Victorian Government that from midnight Sunday people in regional areas will be required to wear face coverings. We are waiting for DET advice about what this means for our school community and will provide this to you when its been received.



#### PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

Hi and welcome to this month's newsletter. The last school holidays seem to be a distant memory as the term quickly rolls on and we continue to deal with many aspects related to Covid-19 (our new normal). Again thank you to parents/carers who are ensuring the wellbeing of others by keeping children at home if they are unwell. ALLERGY and ANAPHYLAXIS An allergy is an overreaction by the body's immune system to a normally harmless substance. Substances that can trigger an allergic reaction are called allergens. Allergic reactions can occur to medication, insect stings and bites, allergens in the environment (eg. pollens, grasses, moulds, dogs and cats), or proteins (most often) in the foods we eat. Individuals can have mild/moderate or severe allergies. Anaphylaxis is a potentially life threatening, severe allergic reaction and should always be treated medical as a emergency. Anaphylaxis occurs after exposure to an alleraen (usually to foods, insects or medicines), to which a person is alleraic. Not all people with allergies are at risk of anaphylaxis.

It is important we always have the latest, most up to date information about your child's **Allergies or Anaphylaxis management plans.** Please provide this to our school nurse Leanne Treloar so we can keep everyone informed.

# CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

Child safety is a high priority at Hamlyn Views School and we have zero tolerance for child abuse. In order to ensure the safety of our students we engage in learning activities that support our students to identify who they can speak to if they need help or a have a 'no' or 'yucky' feeling. This includes deliverv of the Respectful **Relationships** program where students work through parts of the health and personal and social capabilities of the Victorian Curriculum. We encourage our families to their student support to develop awareness of the protective behaviours that will help keep them safe from harm and abuse. Each year at Hamlyn Views School we offer whole school incursions such as 'Bravehearts' and the 'Life Education Van' to support students to understand: how they can keep themselves safe, what to do if they feel unsafe and who to ask for help when something does not feel right.
