Annual Improvement Plan 2021

Our school improvement goals for the year include a DET Priority with 3 areas as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. They are;

- 1. Learning, catch-up and extension (Tutor Learning Initiative)
- 2. Happy, active and healthy kids (Positive mental health and wellbeing)
- 3. Connected schools (Community engagement). Our other focus areas are;

4. **Building practice excellence** (Using data to inform strategies that improve behaviour)

5. Empowering students and building school pride (Embedding the 3 tiers of the SWPBS Framework)

6. Setting expectations and promoting inclusion (Building staff capacity to incorporate universal design principles)

Staffing Matters

Congratulations to the following Education Support (ES) Staff on their recent ongoing appointments - Sheridan Ball and Larissa Young. Fiona Foitzik has also been appointed fixedterm for the rest of the year. We have advertised for two additional Education Support Staff and a Graduate Teacher. These positions should be finalised early term two. We will have a number of changes to our Education Support roles in term 2 due to changes of timefraction, contracts ending, resignation, university studies, mixed schedule responsibilities and new requirements for managing Medical Intervention ES. Michele Marcu will provide an update next week.

Disability Inclusion Initiative-*Education for All* The State Government is initiating a new approach to ensure every student of every ability thrives at school and life. The \$1.6 billion investment over 4 years aims to make inclusive education part of everyday practice in all schools and classrooms, and improve the achievement, participation and wellbeing outcomes for students with a disability. Key elements include;

- A new Disability Inclusion Profile (5 year rollout to replace the Program for Students with a Disability with a strengths based approach).
- A new 3 tiered funding model (5 year rollout to provide additional investment to schools)
- Investment in building skills and knowledge in inclusive education (all schools statewide from mid-2021)
- Investment in implementation and disability support roles in regions (significantly increased regionally based support roles).

This should be a positive advance for how schools welcome and include students with a disability and we are fortunate that the Barwon area is one of 3 regions in the state commencing the rollout in the middle of 2021. Specialist schools expect to have a key role in supporting the rollout.
