#### Some Staff Changes

This Friday our Speech Therapist Alice Stubbings will be commencing Parental Leave and we wish her all the very best as she awaits the arrival of her first child.

This term we have welcomed new teacher Sarah Dorney (Early Primary Blue) and Education Support Staff Angie Prime (Foundation Green), Leslie Fry (Early Years Orange) and Zola Lawry (Speech Therapist). We have also appointed Marty Dufty and Olivia Couch in a shared Acting Teacher (Student Leading Engagement) role. Jacqui Chalmers will now be the Secondary PLC Leader with the change to Olivia's role. As a result also, Sharon Miguel will teach Physical Education

#### **Student Attendance**

Regular school attendance is important in supporting student learning progress and achievement. We appreciate parent/carer support in notifying us via SeeSaw, phone call or email to provide an explanation when their child is absent.

An SMS message will be sent at 11:00am on the day if the school has not been informed about a student's absence. Letters will also be sent home periodically where absences are unexplained. Please note, where families are taking an extended holiday then the school should be informed so an Absence Learning Plan created to support the provision of appropriate learning activities the student can do whilst they are away.

A Medication Authority Form must be signed by the parent/guardian and treating doctor or nurse.

My name is Bingyao, and I am the music therapist at Hamlyn Views School. I have primarily worked with children with various disabilities, often visiting them at home and developing home-based music strategies.

At Hamlyn Views School I visit classrooms and have group sessions with the students. The music therapy program provides an outlet for a child's emotional expression, enhances self-confidence, improves social skills and communication through active music-making, receptive listening, and movement. I also have a band with our senior secondary students, where we jam to favorite music and sing our hearts out.

**Changes to COVID Restrictions** 



- Face masks are no longer required but can be worn if chosen to do so.
- Staff and students who test positive for COVID-19 must follow 7-day isolation period requirements.
- Household contacts are not required to quarantine. If they return to school, they must notify the school, RAT test each school day and wear a mask indoors (if over 8 years old and without an exemption).
- Vaccination evidence for visitors not performing work, is no longer required.
- RAT screening will continue for the first 4 weeks of Term 2. For our school, it is recommended to test 5 days a week.
- Vaccinations and boosters remain the best way to ensure protection for students and staff.
- Maintaining good hand hygiene, social distance and STAY HOME if you or your child are unwell.
- At Hamlyn Views School we will continue to temperature check students each morning for at least the first four weeks of term two.

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## Disability Inclusion Profiles Information Session

The <u>Disability Inclusion Profile</u> is a new tool and process to help schools and families identify the strengths, needs and educational adjustments schools can make for the individual student. The profile and surrounding process will progressively replace the Program for Students with Disabilities (PSD) application processes.

#### **RAT Survey**

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Important feedback on the rapid antigen testing (RAT) program is being sought from our school community through a short survey that has been developed by the Department of Health.

RATs are helping students and staff to safely attend school by ensuring positive cases are identified as quickly as possible. All RATs ordered by the Victorian government for schools are effective in detecting coronavirus (COVID-19) variants, including Omicron.

To help evaluate the roll-out of the program to schools in Term 2 and ensure that staff and students have the required support, a short survey is being sent to parents at a sample of Victorian schools.
